Minimum Requirements

The scholarships are available to male high school seniors who will graduate in the spring of the academic year for which he is applying *or* current college students in an active chapter of Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity, Inc. under the jurisdiction of the Columbus, Ohio Alumni Chapter. Current college students and high school students will compete in separate divisions for scholarships.

The applicant should earn 18 points on seven end of course state exams (Ohio's State Test) or earn remediation-free scores in mathematics and English on either the ACT or SAT or secure an industry credential, workforce readiness [high school applicants only].

College Applicants/Active Chapter Members:

Project into the future. Write either a reflective (from personal experience and involvement) or informational (research based) essay describing the challenges your fraternity, Kappa Alpha Psi, Inc. faces in the next quarter of a century. Issues addressed can include relevance of fraternal organizations for the common college student, intake challenges, and more committed membership among other factors.

College applicants: If your active chapter is under investigation for hazing, your application will be tabled. Upon receipt of a clean bill of health on your college/ university's Office of Greek Affairs or Office of Student Life indicating the chapter has been cleared will serve as proof that your application can proceed. If such a determination is not made within the timeline for receipt and for judging of your application then the questionable status will render your application as ineligible for consideration.

Note: KLHESF scholarships are generally held for each recipient for one academic semester. Any scholar that is awarded a KLHESF scholarship must secure it within the first semesters after graduating from high school; or within two semesters if awarded as a college student. If an award is not claimed within the immediate semester of the award (unless an awardee has delayed entering school -- i.e., as in a "gap year") the awardee is subject to forfeit the award.

Last year, nine scholarships for a minimum of \$1,000.00 were awarded to area students.
